Driving radio control cars is an enjoyable hobby and also a competitive sport but the vast range of different types of models now available can prove confusing for those new to the scene. Radio Control Car Manual starts by providing all the information needed to choose the right model and goes on to present advice on how to build kits as well as driving techniques maintenance modifying set up and the various different classes of racing. It's a little long in the tooth and requires updating but then the technology moves so rapidly there's bound to be developments between the author signing it off and it being available.
