9780563495826 Contains all the elements you expect from a Paul Temple adventure from inanimate objects that conceal bombs to strange things left in the Temples' car to Steve being sort-of abducted by the baddies. Paul Temple and the Vandyke Affair was originally created in 1950 and is an eye-opening experience for those in 2016! The characters are so insanely polite and 'proper' and the sexism so rampant that I wanted to slap the lot of them at one time or another. If you can keep in mind that the characterisation is representative of it's time in history then I'd recommend it as an entertaining 'read' and an intriguing snapshot of 50's English society. From 1938 to 1969 the fictional crime novelist and detective Paul Temple together with his Fleet Street journalist wife Steve solved case after case in one of BBC radio's most popular series.
