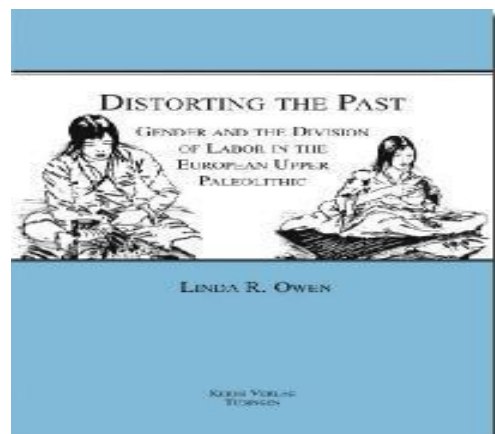

## Distorted patterns of thinking and acting



Did women hunt like men in the Paleolithic? For anyone who doesn't believe that our Paleolithic female ancestors were as capable of men at hunting and trapping (and that they did do these things) this book is for you. **Book Distorting the past pdf** For those of us who already knew from reading about native and indigenous peoples the world over that women's contributions to the family food supply are just as important if not more than the "big game" hunting of men then this book will not come as such a surprise at all. **EBook Distorting the pasta** What is hunting? We are invited early on to rethink our version of hunting; most of us imagine Paleolithic hunting only as big game hunting; think men with spears chasing woolly mammoths. **Distorted partnering** She combs through much of the research and records from early recordings of native peoples as well as the archeological records to show that women performed many (if not all) of the same food-specific tasks as men did: trapping skinning repairing and making weapons setting traps etc. **Book Distorting the past and future** I do still think that my brothers can run faster than I can even when I was running five miles a day and they were both drinking a lot of beer and not much else. **Book Distorting the pastel** Did motherhood get in the way of women as hunters? She then spends about five pages of the entire book trying to dispel the notion that menstruation pregnancy breastfeeding and childcare did not interfere with women's abilities to hunt. **Book Distorting the past book "** But would a breastfeeding mother really leave her child? The tribe (and other other tribal mothers) did indeed take care of other children than their own and yes they could be relied on to suckle other babes. **Book Distorting the past** But as a mother of two both of whom nursed until almost two I find it hard to believe that a mother would leave her breastfeeding child for an extended period of time to go on a hunt especially if it wasn't necessary. **Book Distorting the past and future** However and this I believe after having children of my own I don't think that they would have left their children to pursue big game hunting especially not if there were able-bodied others around. **Book Distorting the pastel** Women could be just as revered for their ability to bring life into the world for the smaller game they caught (rabbit quail fish duck geese) as well as all of the other foodstuffs they gathered (roots tubers insects fruits vegetables grains etc. **Book Distorting the past tense** When one reads any accounts of indigenous peoples the same rigid hierarchy that we have imposed from the outside ceases to matter and both men and women are needed to ensure survival of the group - and that is respected by all. **Distorted patterns of thinking and acting** Owens' research is a much-needed retelling of the archeological data - showing us that the smaller game and plants were every bit as important as large game- I don't know that I can entirely conclude that women occupied the same roles as men at every turn flint-knapping men who kill mammoths horses

and reindeer. **Distorting the Past books** Instead while staying rigorously close to her sources Owen shows that the past was inhabited by diverse kinds of people who responded to specific settings and problems in manifold ways. **Book Distorting the past and present** In this more balanced view of hunting and gathering societies men and children are also central actors and we begin to see Paleolithic life in which the myths that generations of scholars have helped to create are no longer the only illuminated points. **Distorted patterns of thinking and acting** Special emphasis is placed on the division of labor specifically the procurement of food and raw materials and the manufacture and use of implements as I believe that these topics can be investigated successfully within the limits of the archeological record,
