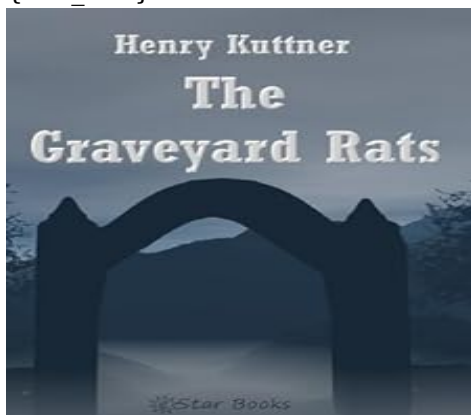


The Graveyard Rats By Henry Kuttner Moore one of the four or five most important writers of the 1940s the writer whose work went furthest in its sociological and psychological insight to making science fiction a human as well as technological literature. Their fantasy novels all of them for the lower grade markets like Future Thrilling Wonder and Planet Stories are forgotten now; their science fiction novel Henry Kuttner was alone and in collaboration with his wife the great science fiction and fantasy writer {site\_link} C. Their fantasy novels all of them for the lower grade markets like Future Thrilling Wonder and Planet Stories are forgotten now; their science fiction novels Fury and Mutant are however well regarded. There is no question but that Kuttner's talent lay primarily in the shorter form; Mutant is an amalgamation of five novelettes and Fury his only true science fiction novel is considered as secondary material. The critic James Blish quoting a passage from Mutant about the telepathic perception of the little blank silvery minds of goldfish noted that writing of this quality was not only rare in science fiction but rare throughout literature: The Kuttners learned a few thing writing for the pulp magazines however that one doesn't learn reading Henry James. In the early 1950s Kuttner and Moore both citing weariness with writing even creative exhaustion turned away from science fiction; both obtained undergraduate degrees in psychology from the University of Southern California and Henry Kuttner enrolled in an MA program planned to be a clinical psychologist. He also published three mystery novels with Harper Row (of which only the first is certainly his; the other two apparently were farmed out by Kuttner to other writers when he found himself incapable of finishing them). Henry Kuttner died suddenly in his sleep probably from a stroke in February 1958; Catherine Moore remarried a physician and survived him by almost three decades but she never published again. Now THAT'S how you tell a story! Less than 20 minutes long you should really go and listen to this narrated here by one of my favourite YT story tellers. SO my goal is to read the stories before seeing the episodes and reviewing both to wit: "The Graveyard Rats is a short story from 1936 by SF/Horror author Henry Kuttner (best known for his story "Mimsy Were the Borogoves" which was adapted into the movie "The Last Mimzy" but that's for another time...). The central character is Old Masson a graveyard caretaker in (perpetually haunted) Salem Massachusetts who is also a grave robber snatching jewelry and other valuables from buried dead folks. However he must contend with rather large rats which have increased in numbers over the years stealing bodies out of their gnawed-through coffins and taking them to their lairs through a complex set of tunnels as if directed by an intelligent/malevolent presence. One day when he sees these rats actually removing a body from its coffin he decides to follow them and show 'em what for and...well now we wouldn't want to give away how Old Masson gets his just desserts but needless to say it's a very creepy and fun story. The more recent one stars David Hewlett as Old Masson and tends to expand the original story into a wider vision of just what is the nature of those tunnels in a very satisfying manner consistent with the Lovecraftian nature of the story. em poucas páginas ele consegue tocar de maneira eficiente em

The protagonist makes probably the most groanworthy horror story error I've read for a long while but it was written in 1936 surprising how long it took 'Scream' and other self referential films to take the mick. English This 1936 Weird Tales story has to be one of the best horror tales of the last century an evil hybrid of Poe's 'Premature Burial' and Lovecraft's 'Pickman's Model' claustrophobic to the nth degree and not to be read by anyone late at night who fears enclosed spaces or asphyxiation and who wishes to sleep. English There's a new series out on Netflix "Guillermo Del Toro's Cabinet of Curiosities" which offers horror stories all introduced by Mr: Del Toro but others are based upon previously published stories, The rats are described in (what else?) Lovecraftian terms: "The rats the old man whispered were messengers between this world and the grim and ancient caverns far below Salem: " The "intelligence" is described as "[coming from] tales of a moribund tribe that is said to exist in the forgotten burrows in the earth, " Needless to say said rats are interfering with Old Masson's "business" but his attempts to eradicate them have been futile. The other adaptation is from 1996 one of three horror stories in a made-for-TV movie "Trilogy of Terror II" (yes there is also an original "Trilogy of Terror"): Anthony plays Laura the dissatisfied wife of a wealthy man whom she and her lover murder for his wealth. Aha! The husband had had all the money transferred to a Swiss bank with the codes buried with him, So Laura becomes the one who needs to get something valuable out of a body. She engages the services of the above-mentioned caretaker/grave robber played by character actor Jeffrey Lewis affecting an Irish accent: So the scenario is a bit different but the basic plot is the same and indeed this adaptation is more consistent with the bare bones of the story.
