For example when Konstantinos dissects the phenomenon of lucid dreaming and why dream interpretation books tend to be a little silly I thought he was dead on. Konstantinos offers no way to confirm that this servant is anything more than an imaginary friend that you're pretending is real, But Konstantinos isn't doing that-- he's proposing that you can do something with magic that is frankly unbelievable and does nothing to convince you of it: While the nocturnal servant was the most egregious example this lack of any substantiation that spells and rituals do anything is a feature of both books: I might not have necessarily believed him but it would be more to go on than Do this spell; unless you screw up it always works: All that said it was interesting reading even if I didn't believe a large percentage of the material covered worked the way the author claims, The
