Owen-Crocker **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon englands lane** 450 1450 (published 2012) She is Director of the Manchester Centre for Anglo Saxon Studies and directs a 5 year AHRC funded project 'The Lexis of Cloth and Clothing' {site_link} {site_link} Since its establishment in 1985 the Manchester Centre for Anglo-Saxon Studies has regularly hosted international interdisciplinary conferences especially an annual Easter Conference. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england flag** The 2006 MANCASS Easter conference titled 'Royal Kingship and Power in Anglo-Saxon England' focused on historical contributions analysing sources of knowledge about royal power; and others which pinpointed loss of power or insecure pretensions to the crown. **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England ebooks online** Others focus on royal retirement into a monastery as renunciation of power by aging or vulnerable monarchs failure to lead troops against an invader and creation of a heroic image to mask weakness in the case of Edmund Ironside. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england furniture** Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England (BAR British Series) Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England (ed Owen-Crocker and Schneider) BAR 584 2016 95 BIG pages This is a collection of essays and whilst all are good Higham's and Williams are outstanding. **Costume Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england map** The shaved head shall not wear the crown (N Higham 10 pages) This was a very insightful paper where Higham dug deep into the context surrounding the ten kings who between 630 and 760 abdicated their thrones to take up a religious life or to go to Rome. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon englander** Treason in Essex in the 990s: the case of Aethelric of Bocking (N Brooks 12 pages) This is an interesting case where Aethelric was left in legal limbo after being accused of treason but the case was never heard owing to him securing high level support by leaving his estate to the Church. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england vs** Promoting royal authority in Anglo-Saxon England: the making of Edmund Ironside (I Howard 8 pages) This paper takes three sources (one now lost but its traces have been detected) written at different times and for varying reasons regarding Edmund Ironside and explores the perceptions created. **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England costume stores** This appears to have been written in the mid 1050s and it has been suggested that this highly favourable account of Edmund was devised to provide his son Edward the Exile with a political platform to enhance his status when he returned from the continent. **PDF Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england map** Coins and Kingship (G Williams 26 pages) Thanks to metal detectorists and the portable antiquities scheme coinage is perhaps the most dynamic area of Anglo-Saxon study of recent years and there's a lot of invaluable information within this paper. **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon englandspiel** Coins merchants and fear of the king: the Old English Seven Sleepers story (M Atherton 12 pages) This is a short but fascinating paper where the OE translation (with added bits of narrative to improve the story) of the Seven Sleepers story is examined to see what it can tell us about Late Anglo-Saxon society and attitudes. **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England costume ideas** For example the Latin pro-consul is translated as portgerefa (town reeve) oaths of loyalty are given more emphasis and the tale of the trial is a window upon how Anglo-Saxon trials should have taken place. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england national** The joy is in the incidental details added by the scribe such as the reeve declaring that Machus should be whipped as the law book stipulates or the reeve being able to reeve. **Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon England costume stores** Whilst the land required to feed the residents of a monastery observing a strict rule would not be overly huge that required for the grazing of sheep and creating parchment would be substantial. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon englander** Kingship and prognostication (M Cesario 11 pages) This one looks at the interaction of celestial events (comets eclipses red moons and the like) with the recording of various untoward events such as notable deaths plagues and invasions. **Book Royal Authority in Anglo-Saxon england flag** Interestingly the biblical language used for describing these events such as 'and then fell a great star from the heaven burning as if a lamp' is the sort of stuff that would have had Erich von Daniken shouting about UFOs which makes me rather glad that he wasn't an Anglo-Saxonist.
