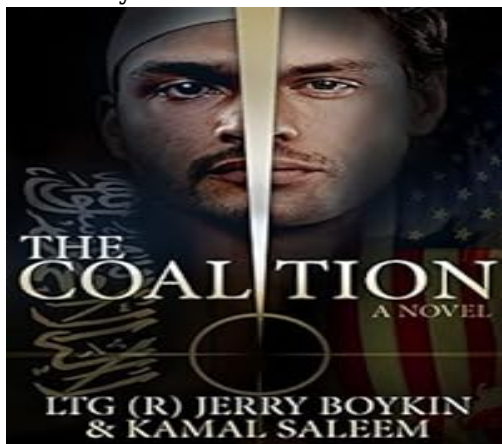


The Coalition By William G. Boykin With the accelerating spread of radical Islam and Sharia law as the backdrop our character-driven novel tells the story of a divided world and two men who epitomize the ideological chasm. His life reads like an action adventure film; Boykin helped capture Panamanian dictator Manuel Noriega hunted notorious drug lord Pablo Escobar and has served in Vietnam Iran Mogadishu Iraq and Afghanistan not to mention a tour with the CIA. There were several issues stemming from this the most glaring of which: at one point the names of the two female love interests (they're so unimpactful I couldn't in good faith call them female leads) are mixed up.
