From Book 1: All Taylor Clark ever wanted was a normal life and a traditional family but so far she's had neither. The town has some quaint aspects to it as well as the mean girl but overall it seems to be a sleepy little town that is home to quite a few ex-convicts who have pretty much turned their lives around. I really don't like giving negative reviews but there were just so many things that were wrong with this story and I feel like I'm the only one who felt this way when I look at the other rave reviews. The positives of the story are that this was a different plot than I am used to so I was super excited to get to witness a come-together or sorts between two complicated and burned people. So we have Taylor a man-hater untrusting woman whose life has taken a path she feels the need to run from—her boyfriend got married to his REAL girlfriend over the weekend and she finds out at work when someone shows her a news article about it. She is so devastated over the lies from her boyfriend Clay using her as a side piece that she literally just jumps ship from her job as a nurse at a hospital and hightails it 24-hours straight to Charity Montana site unseen to her new internet-leased home. What????Once Taylor realizes she's pregnant I understand her frustration on suddenly becoming the single mom in a new town and the stereotyping that will follow but again I find it overused. But Taylor's lawyer is ridiculous and I say that because of the one comment she made Should we stick it to him with child support? That question is something I wouldn't expect out of a lawyer. And finally at the end when Taylor and Joe have realized how they truly feel for each other in their love Taylor is back to the I-don't-trust-men-or-marriage-or-you ultimately causing Joe to give her an ultimatum slightly out of character. Especially as he wants his as yet unborn child! The theme throughout this story is one of trust. There is some stereotyping of both ex-cons and single Mums but the story generally flows well, I liked Joe's character much more than Taylor's! Joe steps up to care for and protect her even though he risks losing more than the woman he loves: Her Baby His Love (Charity Montana #1) I wrote this book and there are a few things I'd like to share about it: This is a story that focuses on tough situations in life using more than the usual point of view characters to reveal information. There isn't cussing in the story and I've chosen to close the door on the sex scenes: I find the super sexy books out there don't keep my interest unless the plot is really strong. As I read along I want to get on with the story and I skip over the sex scenes that mount up after the first one: Yes the first time together for a couple does change things and is important. In most of my books a second love scene much later in the book defines the growth between the characters and helps reveal the level of closeness they've developed: Beyond a couple of love scenes well I skip over to find out what's going to happen next in the book: So that's my little confession and I realize we all have our own reading proclivities, I'll read and reply I promise! Her Baby His Love (Charity Montana #1) I enjoyed this second chance romance story about Taylor and Joe, When Taylor finds out that her boyfriend just got married and that he used her she does what she always does she runs. This time she ends up in the small town of Charity Montana, The townspeople are just like the town's name well most of them are. When she finds out

that she is pregnant shortly after arriving she is not sure what to do, He owns the local nursery as well as being the town's resident handyman and landscaper: There is something between them but they are both wary of a relationship. When Taylor's ex shows up and threatens to sue for custody of the baby things change in the town for Taylor. I am hoping it was so rough because it is an ARC and it hadn't gone through the finale rigamarole of editing because it really needed it, So if you want to know why I rated so low read through my spoilers. I love reading about men taking up the reins in a missing father role. But I feel there could have been so much more depth to these feelings that just weren't described well by the author. Her initial impression is I was hoping I'd had the wrong address but I guess this is the place I've rented she said pointing to the shabby cottage: This is the first thing she speaks to her new neighbor an older woman named Dixie as she pulled into the driveway: But I won't divulge because I may just end up spoiling the whole book and that'd be a shame: Instead of painting a picture of the other characters we get bosomy Mrs: Westcook eccentric Southern lady here in town tall-haired woman one brightly dressed latte-colored grandma: We get ex-convict at every chance when Taylor finds out about Joe's past and all his friends. If this was a normal Kindle release I'd do a search for how many times that phrase is coined; it's that much. Why Joe is so bad in Taylor's book is a mystery to me too: Seriously there could have been so many worse crimes he could have committed that I would label him as an ex-con faster than his measly offense: Taylor is so absorbed in this criminal idea that she can't move past it and it's so frustrating, The teasing dash in his sand-colored eyes made her need a sip of water: Once Joe backtracks from his initial distaste of learning of her pregnancy I do admire his stepping up as her support attending all her appointments and helping at every turn. When Taylor and Joe finally let their attractions (more like awkward staring at each other) go somewhere and get some sexy time the mood is immediately killed by the narration. There was NOTHING at all romantic about how and when and why they come together, And of course they both call it a blaring mistake and he'd just taken advantage of her because she's pregnant. Speaking of heaven I guess this could be categorized as a Christian novel. The narration follows Joe to his men's group sessions at the church every Saturday: He meditates because of what he had learned through the men's church. Joe references the song of Soloman (I think it's Soloman) a few times, Taylor decides to sneak in the church session one day to see what's going on, So it's subtle and no one is directly preaching at the reader to do this or that but it's referenced nonetheless: Clay coming back into the picture was strange and sudden and very short lived, It almost felt added as just another way to add an obstacle for Taylor, It was cute how Dixie and Ram seemed to get the small town to come together and support Taylor and her baby, But he did almost kill a guy a few months ago in his nursery so it could be his character and we just haven't realized it. All in all we get our happily ever after so that is a good thing, She's quite disappointed with the home when she first arrives as it is quite dilapidated and in desperate need of painting. However inside it is much better and the friendly person who manages the rental properties Joe Collins soon gets things fixed and helps her to settle in: Joe also owns and runs the local garden centre and Taylor can't believe how attracted she feels to him despite having sworn off men for the foreseeable future, When she discovers she's pregnant she's even more determined to keep her distance. The author takes the reader through the whole gamut of emotions including some laugh out loud moments, Both the main characters are isolated from most of their family and would love to be the special someone in someone's life. Their relationships with the community are the strongest and their support - well apart from Arlene - is heartwarming. the feeling that the author went into this with a vague idea of what she wanted but nothing actually planned out, This was supposed to be a romance yes? First of all it was all very insta-lovy I can think of zero reasons as to why these characters would even like one another, I'll give you an exact rundown of what happened in every chapter: Her POV: oh no I love him but I'm pregnant and he's an ex-con!! His POV: oh no I love her but I'm an ex-con and she's pregnant!!, Her attitude about people who had been to prison was appalling and it never even got sorted, In one chapter she just randomly goes yep I don't even care he's an ex-con anymore even though she'd still bring it up all the time, Another issue I had was that he was always on the pipeline of we cant be together so we'll stay friends but were they? They weren't even friends most of the time: Most chapters would start by saying that it had been a few weeks and they hadn't talked to one another for whatever demented reason: It's not like I hated it or anything it just didn't have any redeeming features: There are actually so many more things I could complain about but for the sake of my own wellbeing I am deciding not to. This book is a very sweet romance book. I am giving Her Baby.

Montana a sweet little town. Dixie was as good as her word. Joe had a crew working at her place as she slept. But her night time dreams as well. The book was ok. There was build up and then it just ended. Which is totally the case for Taylor Clark. Especially being alone in a new town. More like a honeymoon. Just in case Clay would try and find her.
