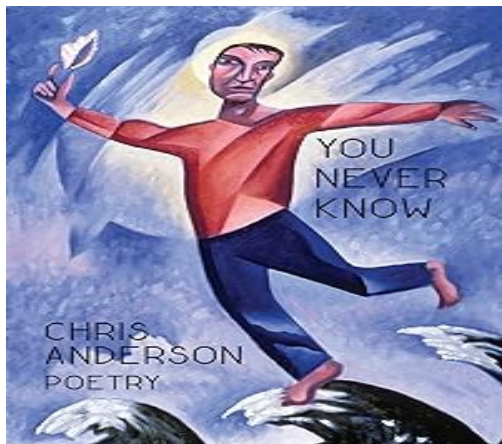


You Never Know By Chris Anderson
