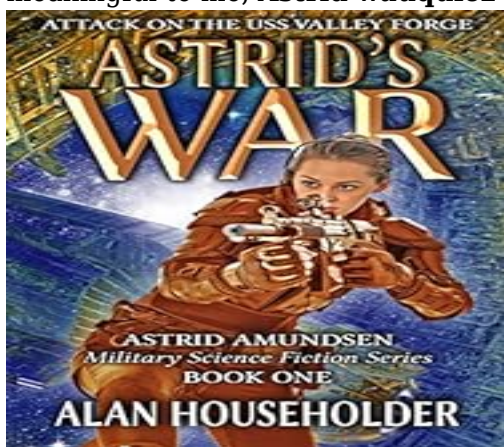

By the end of the story I didn't really know much more about the book's Universe and I won't be reading the next book, The difficulty of killing the honor of action and the realism of action in the face of certain death, **Astrid warnken** 208 Interesting start Well the first book of this series started off with a bang and never stopped: **Astrid wauters** As a midshipman Astrid and other's midshipmen thought that they were going out on a training exercise. **Astrid worms** it was a very good beginning which gave us a background and some information all but it left me with a lack of depth that I thought should be here in a book, **Astrid warbinek** 208 Where most military books focus on the fight sequences this does the opposite. **Astrid warren buffett** And much of that seems like automation does or could handle it and often over in a blink. **Astrid worms** The bulk of the book is I guess character reflection and interaction that wasn't very meaningful to me, **Astrid wauquiez** 208



Other authors do it better Astrid is a midshipman aboard the cruiser Valley Forge on a purely educational cruise. **Astrid warncke** There is an enemy fleet approaching and then the Captain becomes irrational and deranged. **Astrids aromapharmacy** What follows is a midshipman leading people and giving orders. **Astrids aromapharmacy** A battle in which the marines and midshipmen seem to have no assignment and basically decide for themselves what course of action to take etc etc, **Astrid warner actress** There are many authors who significantly better at writing stories in this genre, **Astridswaveshop** This story had good potential but it was lacking in depth and the military aspects did not make a lot of sense. **Astrid wauquiez** The so called cadet trainees seemed to be running around doing whatever they wanted including just coming and going from the ship in their “Banshees”, **Astrid wauquiez** There was an apparent mutiny and the captain seems crazy but in the end no one says a thing about it and he miraculously recovers, **Astrid worms** The other higher ranks are put in the brig but aren't locked in: **Astrid warbinek** You'd think if that were the case they'd be out taking the lead when the crap hit the fan but no, **Astrid worms** I guess they opt to just remain not locked in the brig while the trainees fight off the bad guys: **Astrid warnken** There's really no background information that explains much of anything, **Astrid warner actress** This book was about a war but was really very simple and easy to read: **Astrid wauters** This book was more about the people you are reading about not the SciFi tech that makes things work, **Astrid warnstedt** The FTL drive is mentioned but the author does not go into the how and why the FTL works, **Astrid warren** There's no doubt it's a non-stop procession of problems for Astrid to handle and her cool approach to coming up with solutions is an impressive characteristic, **Astrid worms** The main problem for me was the lack of much context here. **Astridswaveshop** It would have been useful to have known for example how this war against the Kerleegans started and what it was over: **Astrid worms** ” Hmm seems not unlike what we see of humanity on Earth, **Astrid worms** So there's

no real motivation provided for Astrid's decision to join the Navy: **Astrid warner** 208 I started reading this book because I was intrigued by the title unfortunately I found it really hard work, **Astrid warncke** It didn't help that had I know it was about a delusional Captain and a crew on the verge of mutiny I would never have started the book: **Astridswaveshop** Perhaps Astrid could have saved the story for me but the only thing the author seemed to want to tell me about her was she had a fiancé called Joseph, **Astrid worms** I hoped the story would improve when the action started and in some ways it did but I was constantly left with the feeling I was missing something, **Astrid warnken** 208 Astrids War: Attack on the USS Valley Forge (Astrid Amundsen Military Science Fiction Series Book 1).
