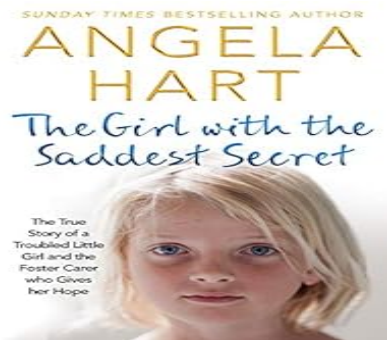

Angela agrees to help . two days respite goes alright but then they are asked to do one more night : The foster carer won't have her back and Angela and her family take her on : some of the outbursts are very mysterious and can be dangerous: The Girl with the Saddest Secret Great book!
