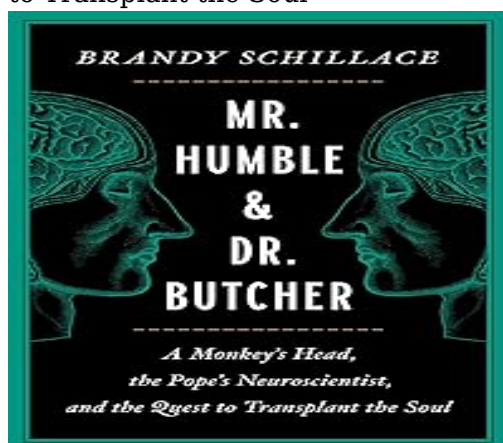

These relevant and pertinent questions bring us to today as the field has continued in White's absence. **Mr. Humble and Dr. butchering supplies**) However in recent years nerve regeneration technology has shown promise; additionally some have developed technology that bypasses the spinal cord by sending signals directly from the brain to local nerve endings.
