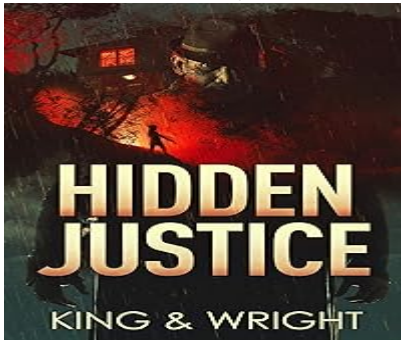

If you enjoy reading authors like Darcey Bell and Harlan Coban movies like A Simple Favor and The Hand That Rocks the Cradle or shows like Ozark and Dead to Me you'll love Nolon King. I now have a whole new series I want to read! Hidden Justice Frank was a cop then a detective: His daughter was murdered also another young girl a friend of hers: He decided he needed to find the killer before it happens in their neighborhood again. So he also planned to sneak into the neighbors home at night searching for clues to find out if any of them did it, A new family moved in across the street with a teenage girl. Good thing he did in a way but also made him look like a suspect again, Is this girl Freda lying or was she really telling the truth, Hidden Justice In 2019.

But picked it up as soon as I could to finish it up as quickly as I could, These characters were full and exciting and the storyline was easy to read: Hidden Justice An Unusual Story This is not the typical who dunnit plot with predictable twists, The author did a great job of showing the workings of two minds as they pursue their target, A highly recommended read if you like something different from the norm, There were tears.

I would have given 5* for sure but the ending was so rushed and put together with so many things happening all at once, It was such a noticeable shift in dynamic as the the rest of 90% of the book that it really spoiled it for me made it kind of cheesy, Hidden Justice I chose to read this book after receiving a free e-copy from Reedsy: All opinions in this review are my own and completely unbiased, Poor Frank Grimm lost both his wife and daughter and the only thing that kept him going was the need to find his daughter's murderer, At first he was sure it was a neighbor who had killed her so he started breaking into their homes to find a clue, Later he broke into their homes because he liked to know what was going on in their lives since there was nothing going on in his except sorrow grief and guilt: They were all quirky (annoying?) in their own way and I could see why he didn't particularly care to talk to them, Mallory Black and her partner Mike were detectives who worked on the murder of Frank's daughter, I did not like Mallory's obsession with Frank because of how it affected her family, It was interesting how much alike she and Frank were and Frank learned his lesson too late: He now realized how important dinner time should be for a family; hopefully Mal could learn that before it was too late for her family: Even though she thought she put her family

first her job always came first. She just wanted to get back to work! And to her her husband's job had little value compared to hers, Hidden Justice is a psychological thriller that I couldn't put down after the first quarter of the book once Frank met his new neighbor Freya, She needed his help Nolon King wrote a superior thriller called Secrets We Keep. Unlike with music I never quite understood how collaborations work when writing fiction, With song writing teams I can see where one member might write the lyrics to a melody the other member composed: But how does that work when two authors are writing the same book?Evidently not very well if Hidden Justice is the example. King's writing skills he did himself no favor by collaborating with Mr, Indeed in wading though much of the aimless artless dialogue in Hidden Justice I wondered if Mr. Hidden Justice tells the story of Frank Grimm a widower and former deputy with a Florida's sheriff's department: A year before his teenage daughter had been murdered and his wife committed suicide: For reasons which are unclear Grimm believes the murderer is a neighbor on the cul-de-sac where he lives: But he's not sure which neighbor so he spends his days breaking into their houses when they're not there looking for clues, As for Grimm after breaking into the house of another teenage girl on his cul-de-sac looking for clues he makes a shocking discovery of his own, He's found a note from the girl hidden in her bedroom and apparently addressed to him that her father is raping her and would Frank please kill him for her. I've just saved you some time better spent doing anything but reading this book: Mel is a lady active detective while Frank is a retired one from the same sheriff's department, Frank's story is horrendous and he is searching for closure in his neighbor's homes literally: Mel believes Frank is the main actor in his crime story the rest of the department knows Frank and he could never do what Mel in her gut believes: Frank in this delving comes across events that Mel is certain Frank has committed. Those events come to a deadly conclusion where Frank pulls the trigger: Mel gives him a pass because she realizes his nature is contrary to what she believed: The writing is fast-paced with thrilling twists and turns at the right moments keeping the reader engaged. Hidden Justice This was definitely a page turner! I had to put it down for a little bit because of work fears mystery misjudgement and finale, I can't wait to read more stories Hidden Justice Frank's daughter Jenny was killed several years and he a former detective was determined he would find the killer, He broke into neighbor's homes to make sure they had not killed Jenny, Then he entered their home when empty and saw things that indicated problems. Freda eventually became friends and Fra k realized how threatened Freda and her mother were, Tu Amal another detective was determined Frank had killed his daughter. His stories are dark twisty and often decidedly close to home, He's not afraid to explore the darker side of human nature through stories featuring families torn apart by secrets and lies. When not writing you will find Nolon drinking black coffee and observing humans in their natural habitats[1]

And he was determined to help her no matter what. The ending was perfect. Franks wife committed suicide because of what happened. Frank was a suspect at first . He kept a eye on her right away. I needed to know what happened to Freya and her mother. I just couldn't read it fast enough. The ending though unexpected gave me a satisfied feeling. Hidden Justice FantasticThis was an amazing book.I did like it overall. She wasn't even concerned with her daughter's anxiety. A year later in 2020 King collaborated with one David W.
